### **Ref. Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme – Silver Award**

We are thrilled to be offering the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme to our current Year 10 cohort. We would like to take this opportunity to explain to you a little bit about the award and how your child will benefit from participating.

### **What is The Duke of Edinburgh Award?**

It is recognition of a young person's successful journey of self-discovery and development, acclaimed by employers and universities alike for demonstrating the qualities developed within young people who achieve it. It is a balanced programme that develops the whole person - mind, body and soul, in an environment of social interaction and team working. There are three progressive levels of DofE programmes which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award. The Silver Award takes approximately 8-12 months to complete.

### **There are four sections to the award: Volunteering, Physical, Skills and Expedition.**

The first three sections are carried out independently but with support from the DofE Coordinators. Each student will choose activities personal to them.

If they have completed the Bronze Award then the volunteering section needs to be completed for 6 months. For the Physical and Skill, one needs to be completed for a period of 6 months and the other 3 months.

If they have not completed the Bronze award, then they need to complete a further 6 months in either the volunteering section or the longer of the other two.

It is advised that the commitment should be for around one hour every week for each. It may be that they are already taking part in an activity that falls into one of the sections, in which case they will now be able to gain recognition for this. Equally, we will be encouraging pupils to undertake new experiences.

All participants are registered online to carry out their award on the eDofE website. It is a vital part of the award that your child recognises the need to regularly check and update their sections on this website as this is the main channel of communication between us and the participants. Once completed, all awards are submitted for approval at the county via eDofE, therefore if your child has not been updating their profile regularly, they will not receive their award.

The expedition, a two night, three day, walking/camping trip in the local area, is done as part of a group of between five and seven students. Training, practice and the qualifying expedition will take place in the spring and summer terms of this school year.

### How much does it cost?

It costs £75 to complete the DofE Silver Award, however some kit will be required for the expedition.

Once signed up to eDofE they will receive a discount at certain outdoor stores to help with these purchases. If you require any help if funding then please contact us.

### What if my child receives Free School Meals?

If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, then we can apply for funding to cover part of the cost of the award. Each funding application is considered on an individual basis and we will contact you individually to inform you whether the application was successful.

### What if my child doesn't receive Free School Meals?

If your child is not eligible for Free School Meals but you require help with the cost of this adventure, please contact us, equipment can be lent out from ICC and other funding is available to help cover enrolment costs.

### What if my child decides to drop out of the award?

If your child decides to withdraw from the award at any time throughout the year, we will not be able to refund payments.

Please can you have a discussion with your child if they are interested, complete the emailed form and complete the on-line form. The initial deposit of £37.50 is payable on enrolment and the balance of £37.50 is due before February Half term.
